



In Primary One our work is presented in topic form to tie all areas of learning together as much as possible.

This leaflet outlines what we will be covering in May / June in Numeracy and Literacy and through the themes of **Beach Shop/Café** and **The Travel Agent** so that home learning can be organised to support your child.

Please Note: - *Not all aspects of each subject are included in this document and all children work at different levels of ability.*

Numeracy

Number - Rote count to 20; sets to 10 (make, write and order); continue and devise patterns; recognise coins to £2.

Data Handling - Use and discuss mapping diagrams; represent data using objects.

Pictures or simple graphing programmes.

Shape & Space - Sort 2D shapes; sort 3D-shapes for one criterion with guidance.



Literacy



Talking and Listening - Identify words and phrases in sentences; sharing their thoughts and feelings with different audiences.

Reading - Read additional texts at an independent level; read simple words by sounding out and blending the phonemes from left to right; attempt unknown words and features of words e.g. long and short words; predict what will happen next.

Writing— Demonstrate more control over their writing; write sentences with a measure of independence.

Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities

TSPC is a cross—curricular aspect of the primary curriculum. Through numeracy, literacy and other areas of the curriculum the pupils will become engaged in problem solving activities and discussions which will require them to take on different roles and develop confidence.
